The North Thiladhunmathi Atoll (Ha. Atoll) is governed by the Secretariat of the Ha. Atoll Council. It is the third-largest atoll in the Maldives in terms of land area and population, comprising 42 islands, only 14 islands remain inhabited. The remaining 28 islands are uninhabited.

Dhidhdhoo serves as the capital of Haa Alif Atoll in the Maldives and has a total population of 4,707, comprising 2,293 females and 2,385 males. The island is centrally located within the atoll and is administered by the Secretariat of the Dhidhdhoo Council under the authority of the local government.

Dhidhdhoo is widely recognized for its status as a crime-free community, with incidents related to drugs and theft being extremely rare. The island is also celebrated for its natural beauty, boasting pristine beaches and breathtaking scenery that significantly enhance its appeal.

The distance between Dhidhdhoo in Haa Alif Atoll and Hanimaadhoo in Haa Dhaalu Atoll can be covered in approximately 19 minutes by speedboat, assuming a travel speed of 30 knots.
