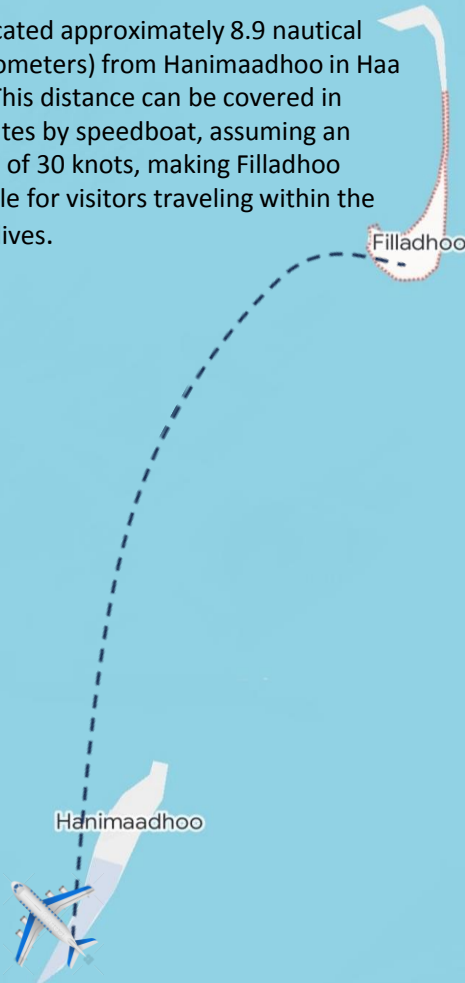


CONVENIENT ACCESS

Filladhoo is located approximately 8.9 nautical miles (16.5 kilometers) from Hanimaadhoo in Haa Dhaalu Atoll. This distance can be covered in about 18 minutes by speedboat, assuming an average speed of 30 knots, making Filladhoo easily accessible for visitors traveling within the northern Maldives.

The North Thiladhunmathi Atoll (Ha. Atoll) is governed by the Secretariat of the Ha. Atoll Council. It is the third-largest atoll in the Maldives in terms of land area and population, comprising 42 islands, only 14 islands remain inhabited. The remaining 28 islands are uninhabited.

LAND MARKS & LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

Mosque(Tharaagandu)

The island features a historic mosque, constructed more than 200 years ago from wood and stone, which has been renovated while maintaining its cultural importance. The mosque includes significant artifacts such as an ancient stone pit and a time stone. Furthermore, the site known as Tharaagandu was revealed in 2009 to be a Muslim cemetery over 600 years old, confirmed by the discovery of human bones and tombstones.

Shipwreck Near Filladhoo

Filladhoo is home to the intriguing tale of the Greek ship Captain Pantelis, which sank off its coast in 1963 while carrying mineral-rich rocks. Though mostly submerged, four pistons remain visible above water. Now a vibrant marine habitat, the wreck attracts divers and local adventurers alike.

What truly sets Filladhoo apart is its preserved traditional fishing culture and close-knit community. Unlike more developed islands, Filladhoo has maintained its authentic way of life, with fishing remaining the primary livelihood. Its remote location has helped safeguard its untouched beaches and vibrant coral reefs, making it an ideal destination for travelers seeking natural beauty, cultural depth, and a genuine Maldivian experience.
