The North Thiladhunmathi Atoll (Ha. Atoll) is governed by the Secretariat of the Ha. Atoll Council. It is the third-largest atoll in the Maldives in terms of land area and population, comprising 42 islands, only 14 islands remain inhabited. The remaining 28 islands are uninhabited.

ABOUT US

Hoarafushi is an inhabited island in the northernmost atoll of the Maldives, located within the country's largest fringing reef. It comprises three naturally connected islands—Hoarafushi, Bodufinolhu (connected in the late 1700s), and Kudafinolhu (joined in 2013)—along with eight nearby uninhabited islets. Covering 110 hectares with 580 households, it lies 317.57 km north of Malé and has a population of 3,613. In 2006, 171 residents from Berinmadhoo were resettled here. Fishing is the island's main economic activity

Hoarafushi features stunning sandy beaches, crystal-clear shallow waters, and a peaceful lagoon surrounded by uninhabited islands—an ideal escape for nature lovers and history seekers.

Kuda Miskiy, an old mosque which people used to pray was believed to be built around 1912. The mosque is now left abandoned as a heritage of the island.

Ziyaaraay is believed to be the burial site of a religious scholar from around 150 years ago. The islanders have preserved it with deep respect and care ever since

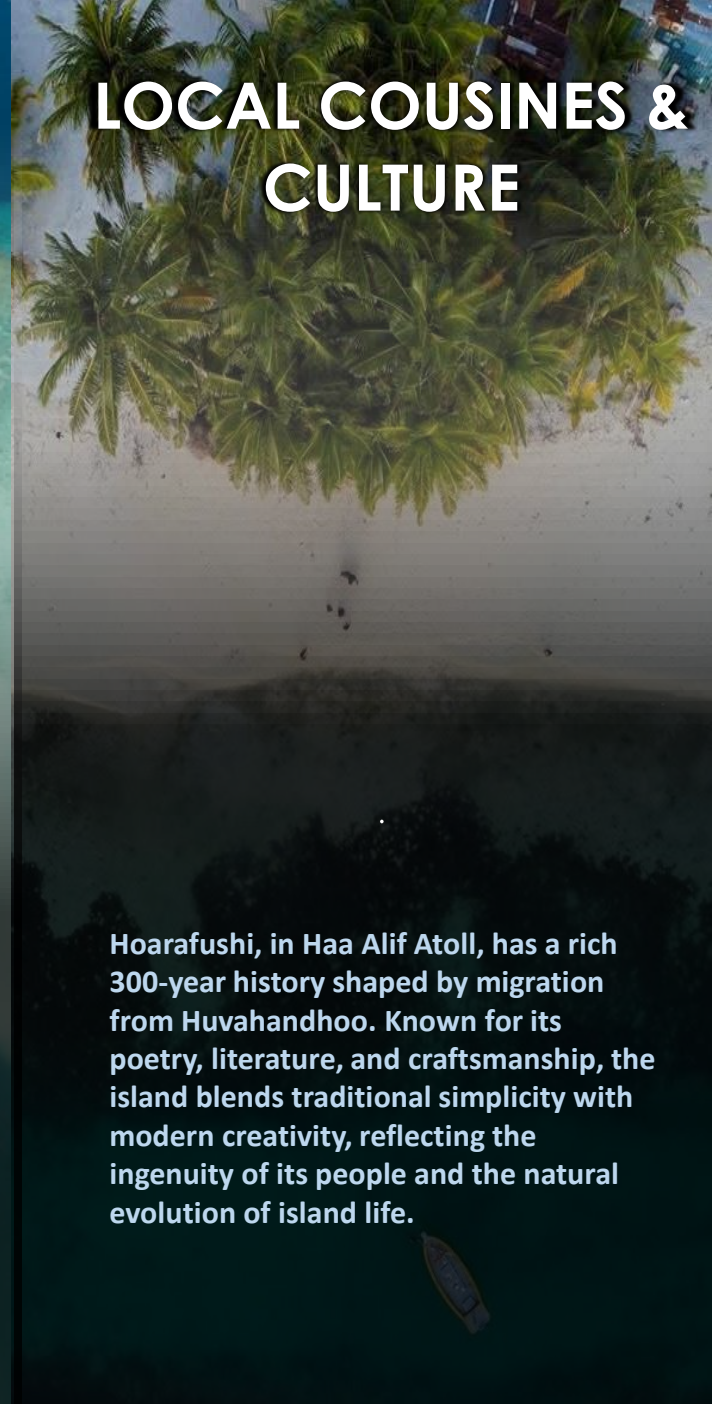
