Uligamu is located approximately 7.5 nautical miles from Haa Alifu Huvarafushi, with a travel time of about 15 minutes by speedboat at 30 knots—making it easily accessible for both visitors and locals.

The North Thiladhunmathi Atoll (Ha. Atoll) is governed by the Secretariat of the Ha. Atoll Council. It is the third-largest atoll in the Maldives in terms of land area and population, comprising 42 islands, only 14 islands remain inhabited. The remaining 28 islands are uninhabited.

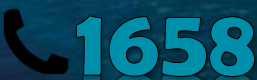

Uligamu (Uligan), located 177 nautical miles north of Malé in Haa Alif Atoll, is a picturesque island in the northwest Indian Ocean. Renowned for its natural yacht harbor, it serves as a key stopover for vessels crossing the Arabian Sea, offering a peaceful place to rest and refuel. The island is known for its rich marine life, lush greenery, and warm hospitality. Adding to its natural charm is a rare ancient tree found exclusively in the Maldives, further enhancing Uligamu's appeal as both a scenic retreat and a maritime hub.

LAND MARKS & LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

Discover Uligamu’s rich heritage through its key landmarks, including a modern Friday Mosque inspired by Malé’s historic mosque and minaret. Donated by the Alifulhu Thuthu Foundation, it symbolizes cultural pride and unity. The island also preserves traditional stone houses, with two still featuring original thatched palm roofs—a rare glimpse into Maldivian architectural history.

Uligamu, once home to the world’s first hybrid microgrid wind farm, showcased a strong commitment to sustainability. Though now inactive, the project highlighted the island’s innovative approach to renewable energy.

The Uligamu Forest, located in the Kudadhookolhu area, is home to a variety of species, including fish, flies, and crabs. Notably, it features the rare "Fili" tree, uncommon in the Maldives. The Island Council has taken steps to protect this unique natural habitat.
